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MOCA Awarded Energy Management Contract by Alouette Cheese

NEWTON, Mass. – Sept. 16, 2011 – MOCA Systems Inc. (MOCA) was recently contracted by Alouette Cheese USA LLC to improve the way it manages its New Holland, Penn. production plant's energy use. MOCA helped Alouette analyze its energy use, identify savings opportunities, and prioritize and manage the implementation of improvements to reduce energy consumption.

MOCA provided Alouette Cheese with an extensive energy audit to identify areas where improvements could be made to its processes. It included determining baseline energy and water use, end-use analysis of the facility's energy, and potential conservation measures. MOCA assessed the facility's refrigeration systems, HVAC, Building Automation System (BAC), lighting, and waste streams to identify the best ways to reduce the facility's energy consumption. MOCA provided program management and coordination for the implementation of these improvements, including upgrades of the HVAC and other systems, finding utility rebates, and recycling programs for cardboard, water, and other waste.

The facility consists of three components: a stand-alone cooler/refrigeration building, a wastewater treatment plant, and a production and storage building containing process equipment (mixing and storage tanks, heat exchangers), walk-in coolers, compressed air equipment, and homogenization/pasteurization processes.
