MOCA Systems awarded program and construction oversight contract for \$1 billion Fort Lee, VA BRAC Program

Watertown, MA (June 10, 2007) - MOCA Systems was awarded a \$3 million, 3-year contract from the Army Corps of Engineers' Norfolk division to provide project control oversight for the design and construction of the \$1 billion Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) program at Fort Lee, VA

Fort Lee is expected to gain 10,000 new jobs from BRAC. There will be over 6 million square feet of new construction valued at \$1 billion, through the establishment of the Combat Service Support Center and the Joint Culinary and Transportation Management Center. In June 2007, construction contracts were awarded for the initial facilities including the Sustainment Center of Excellence and the Logistics University.

The MOCA Systems project control team includes Parsons Technology and Infrastructure and L-3 Communications as sub-contractor teaming partners.

Virgil Gray, MOCA's Vice President, stated "we look forward to continuing our support to the Army Corps on this challenging BRAC program. Using the MOCABuild™ platform, our team will continue to help identify realistic costs integrated with construction durations to best program and execute. At both the master program level and individual construction oversight, our team will support the Army Corps to meet the Fort Lee BRAC requirements of being complete by September 2011."
